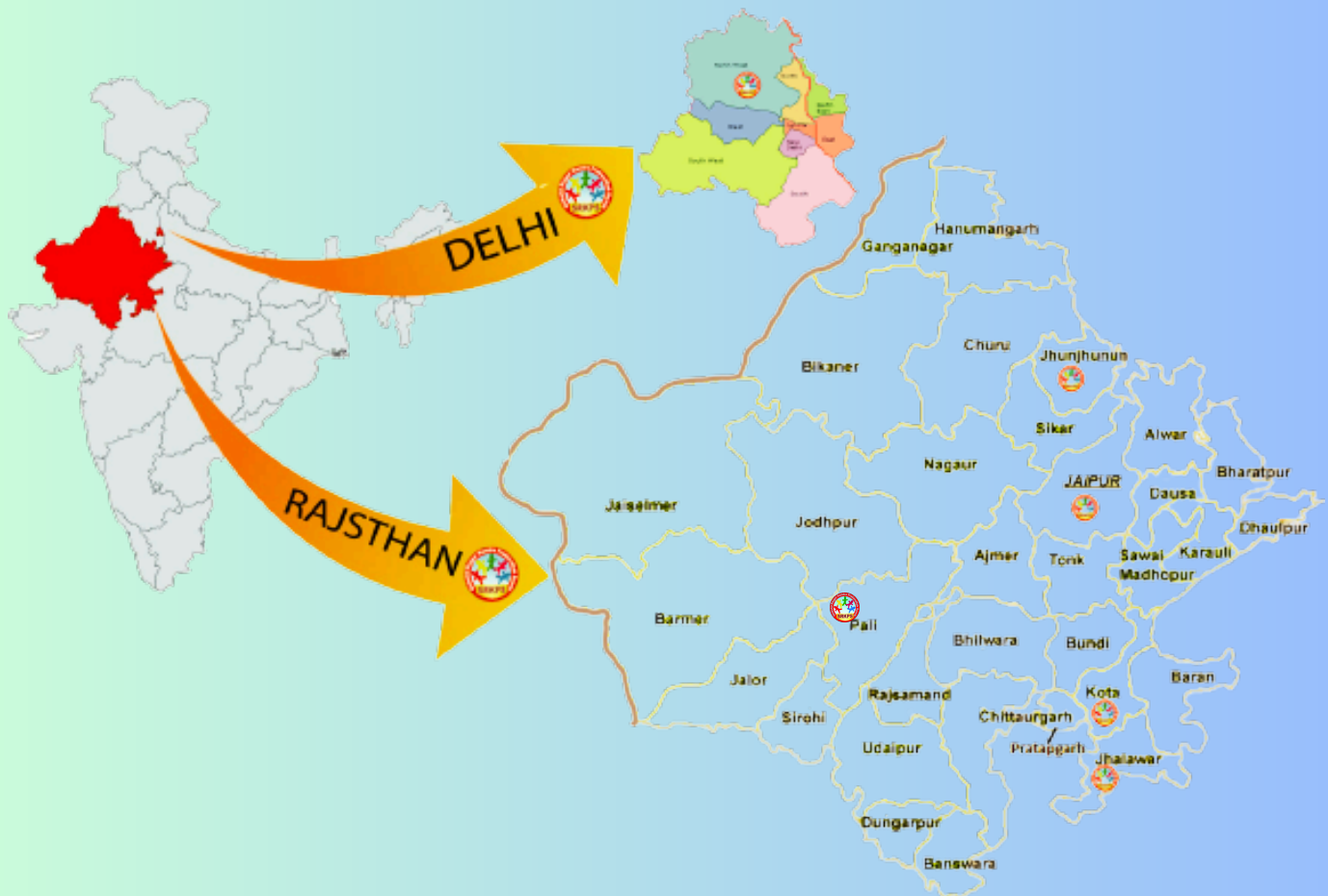

# TARGETED INTERVENTION(TI)

Targeted intervention as a strategy for prevention has proved to be an effective means to contain the prevalence of HIV in the state of Rajasthan.

# COMPONENTS OF TI



# PEOPLE WHO INJECTING DRUGS(PWID)

Targeted interventions for Injecting Drug Users (IDUs) are crucial in HIV prevention. HIV spreads rapidly among IDUs who share injection equipment. Once prevalent among IDUs, it can swiftly reach their sexual networks. Some IDUs also work as sex workers, linking HIV transmission in IDU networks to larger high-risk sexual networks. With RSACS (Rajasthan State AIDS Control Society) funding, a TI project began in March 2011 in Kota, Rajasthan, targeting 600 IDUs.

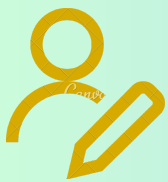
The project currently has 745 registered IDUs.

## Activities:

- Distribute syringes and condoms to prevent HIV/AIDS.
- Perform HIV and STI tests in ICTC and F-ICTC.
- Establish links with referral centers (ART, STD, DOTS, OST).
- Foster a supportive environment for IDUs.
- Motivate IDU community for HIV prevention.
- Conduct regular health check-ups and treat infections for IDUs.
- Shift high-risk behavior to low-risk for IDUs.
- Educate on safe needle application techniques for IDUs.

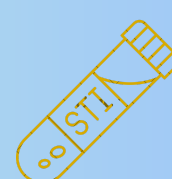

# TI ON FEMALE SEX WORKERS (FSWS)

The targeted intervention project aims to prevent HIV/AIDS, aligning with NACP goals. Core groups include Female Sex Workers (FSW), MSM, and IDUs, with bridge populations like Migrants and Truckers also at risk. Bhawani Mandi, known for its railway station and large orange market, attracts HRs seeking business. The orange industry operates for 8 months, drawing workers from various regions. Approximately 8400 HRGs are employed in the local factories.

SRKPS focuses on one core composite high-risk group(HRG) of people who are most in danger under core composite Targeted Intervention, namely female sex workers (FSWs).

The TI project outlines key components for achieving its goal:

- Behavior Change Communication
- STI Management
- Condom Promotion
- Enabling Environment
- Community Mobilization
- Referrals and Linkages
- Monitoring and Evaluation

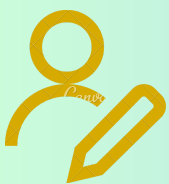

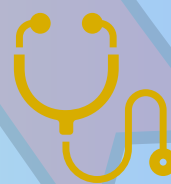

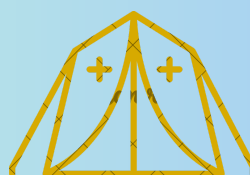

## Objectives:

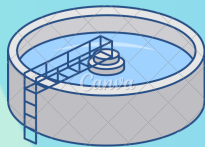
- To provide affordable and sustainable solution to store seasonally available water.

- To ensure effective monitoring and supervision, to achieve the milestones and deliverables as per schedule.



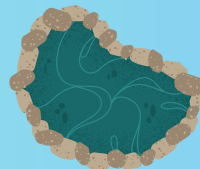

SRKPS in collaboration with Department of Education, Government of Rajasthan and MPower, an Aditya Birla Education Trust Mumbai initiative, aims to promote mental health and well-being in educational institutions for students across Jaipur, Kota, Sikar and Jhunjhunu district of Rajasthan.

# Tobacco Control

## Advancing Comprehensive Tobacco control in Rajasthan through institutional development, capacity building and effective implementation of MPOWER measures

The project aimed to make 13 districts of Rajasthan compliant with India's tobacco control legislation (COTPA) through institutionalization, capacity building, implementation, and enforcement. In addition, the project supported the state in developing comprehensive guidelines under FCTC 5.3 to counter tobacco industry interference and in implementing vendor licensing to regulate and restrict the availability of tobacco. The project also assisted in developing policies aligned with the Tobacco-Free Generation initiative, aiming to reduce the future prevalence of tobacco use.

To strengthen tobacco control efforts in Rajasthan, the project focused on high-level sensitization of policymakers, capacity building among enforcement officials at both state and district levels, and supporting the formulation of new policies upon the request of the Government. The project engaged with policymakers, enforcement officials, and officials of urban and local bodies, as well as Panchayati Raj Institutions, to reinforce the state's tobacco control enforcement mechanism.

SRKPS also closely collaborated with state and district-level CSOs, NGOs, networks, media houses, and communities to incorporate tobacco control activities and messages into their missions, fostering sustained behavioral change to 'denormalize' tobacco within society at large.



### Objectives:

- 1: Strengthen the institutionalization of NTCP and COTPA implementation including monitoring and reporting within the state to sustain tobacco control efforts across the state Rajasthan, with a focus on 13 intervention districts.
- 2: Support capacity building and sensitization of key stakeholders at state and district level.
- 3: Support state and district cell to adopt new policies to strengthen and advance tobacco control.
- 4: Conduct strategic, policy-focused research for monitoring and evaluation of tobacco control implementation.

# STEM Education Lab

In the context of 21st-century education, SRKPS in collaboration with Charvi Empowerment Society developed Science kits designed to offer a comprehensive and skill-enriching experience for students. These Science DIY kits provided numerous benefits aimed at fostering creativity, collaboration, and critical thinking. The STEM kits included 80 working models covering science, mathematics, and geology, complete with an activity list tailored to all classes. Additionally, the program supplied teachers with manuals and provided training to ensure effective use of the labs. Beyond cognitive development, these kits encouraged teamwork, communication, and problem-solving skills among students. By integrating these STEM kits into the curriculum, students were better prepared for future challenges and careers, particularly in STEM fields. The program also included the repair and maintenance of school facilities, such as toilets, ensuring a conducive learning environment for the students.

- Developing infrastructure for the STEM Mini Science Labs.
- Installing the STEM Mini Science Labs.
- Supplying teachers with manuals.
- Training teachers from Government schools.
- Maintaining the STEM labs for 1 year.
- Conducting repair work on toilets in the 5 schools where the STEM Mini Science Labs were installed.

## Elimination of Gender Biased Sex Selection with PCPNDT Act

The Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act, 1994, was enacted in India to prohibit sex selection before or after conception and to curb the growing practice of female foeticide. The act aims to regulate the use of prenatal diagnostic techniques to prevent their misuse for determining the sex of the fetus, which has led to a skewed sex ratio in many parts of India.

SRKPS plays a crucial role in enforcing the PCPNDT Act in Delhi and Rajasthan by collaborating with state PCPNDT cells to identify and eliminate gender-biased sex selection practices. The organization conducts decoy operations (stings) to expose illegal sex determination centers, supporting authorities in building strong cases against violators. By enhancing the monitoring and enforcement of the PCPNDT Act, SRKPS is actively contributing to the fight against gender discrimination and the protection of the girl child.

## School Sponsorship Program- Rajasthan Charitable Trust UK

Rajasthan Charitable Trust, UK, in partnership with SRKPS, significantly impacted the education sector in Rajasthan through sponsorship from April 2023 to March 2024. This funding aimed to uplift socially and economically disadvantaged children, providing them with essential resources for a brighter educational future.

The funds were distributed across 18 government schools, focusing on enhancing the learning environment. Scholarships were awarded to deserving students, ensuring financial barriers do not hinder their academic progress. To modernize education, smart boards and computers were installed, making learning more interactive and engaging for students.

Cultural activities were also sponsored to foster creativity, build self-confidence, and preserve Rajasthan's rich heritage among young students. Additionally, the Trust sponsored the higher education of five students for the 2023-24 academic year, ensuring talented individuals can pursue their studies without financial constraints.

The initiatives by Rajasthan Charitable Trust, UK, and SRKPS reflect a strong commitment to educational advancement. By investing in infrastructure and directly supporting students, they are enhancing lives and contributing to the broader socio-economic development of the region. The community deeply values this support and looks forward to continued collaboration in the future.

This community radio station is instrumental in promoting SDG 16, encouraging civic participation, dialogue, and fortifying local institutions. Moreover, it acts as a driving force for SDG 17, fostering collaborations among communities, governments, NGOs, and stakeholders. Through shared information and teamwork, it empowers communities for grassroots sustainable development.

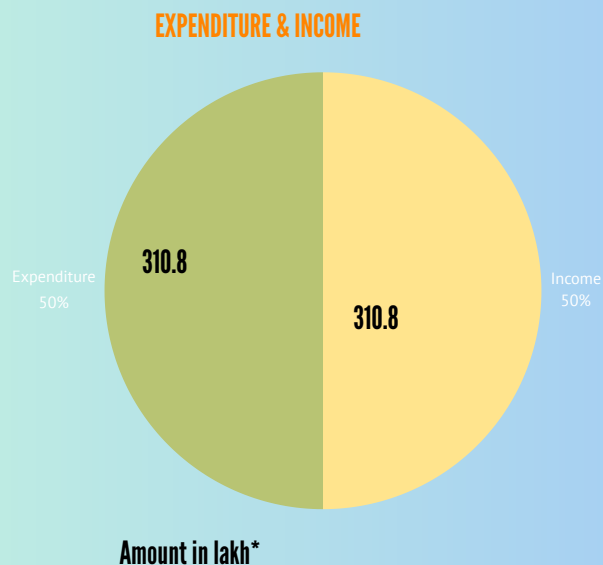
